Inspiring futures for people living with sight loss

Welcome to Outlook Autumn 2018

As you can imagine, we were delighted to be named Best Third Sector Business at the Cornwall Business Awards earlier this year. We wanted to capitalise on this success, so we've been working more closely with the business sector to help improve accessibility for customers with visual impairments.

In particular, we've teamed up with a number of local visitor attractions including the Eden Project, Tate St Ives and the Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro to help them identify ways to make their venues and communications more accessible.

As well as carrying out mystery shopping audits, we've provided training to staff and volunteers so that they have a better understanding of how to welcome visually impaired visitors to their venues and how to enhance their overall experience on the day.

We've also been working with local organisations to provide employment support. Our new 'Employ-Ability' project focuses on helping people with sight loss to remain in employment or get back into the work place by breaking down any barriers they might face.

Finally, I would like to thank everyone who has supported our Sight Appeal so far. We have already raised £25,000 and still have many more fundraising activities planned. Launceston Low Vision Clinic

In July we launched a new low vision clinic at the Specsavers store in Launceston. The low vision clinic is a free service, by appointment only, for people with eye conditions that cannot be improved with prescription glasses or surgery. Following an assessment, low vision aids such as magnifiers, solar shields and MaxTV glasses can be taken away on a free long-term loan basis.

The clinic will be held every six to eight weeks to make it easier for people in Launceston and the surrounding areas to get an appointment closer to home. This is in addition to the five other low vision clinics that we already have in Truro, Helston, Bodmin, St Austell and Penzance.

Don't forget, if you would like to book a free assessment you will need a referral from your optician or eye hospital consultant first.

Grace, who was born with sight loss, received a laptop through our Inspiring Futures Fund and put it to good use by getting in touch with a number of other local organisations to help her deliver the workshops.

One of those organisations was the conservation group Beach Guardian who provided her with some interesting art materials. The Beach Guardian team regularly collect litter washed up onto the beach which they then clean and sterilise for use in educating people about the impact of pollution. Grace, who has an interest in both art and conservation, found the perfect use for some of this beach litter as the bright colours and different textures make great art materials for her sensory workshops.

Tate St Ives

We've been working with Tate St Ives to help them make the art gallery and facilities even more inclusive for people with visual impairments. As a result they have launched regular Talking Art events designed for blind and partially sighted visitors and friends.

During each session, visitors will have the opportunity to handle some of the objects and listen to detailed spoken descriptions of the works on display. Practical activities will also bring the artworks to life.

Talking Newspapers

If you enjoy keeping up to date with local news but find it difficult to read newspaper print, talking newspapers are an excellent option. We are lucky enough to have three different talking newspaper associations in Cornwall, all run by volunteers and all completely free.

How it works

Every week volunteers read articles from the local newspapers which are recorded onto a USB stick and delivered to your door free of charge. The USB stick can be played on a computer or an MP3 device with a USB socket, such as a Sonic Player or a Sovereign Boombox.

All you have to do when you have finished listening is pop the USB stick back in the envelope provided, turn the address label over to show the address of the talking newspaper association and post it back in time for the process to start all over again. The postage is free because it qualifies for Royal Mail's 'Articles for the Blind' scheme. All that the talking newspaper associations ask is that you return your USB stick in good time. If not, you may miss out on the following week's news.

If you would like to receive one or more of the talking newspapers, please contact the associations directly. They would be delighted to talk you through the process in more detail and add you to their weekly mailings.

Sonic 2 USB Player

The Sonic 2 is a lightweight USB player that is ideal for listening to talking newspapers and books, as well as our very own Outlook magazine.

The simple design makes it easy to navigate between tracks and it automatically remembers the last position it played on your memory stick.

It is available to buy from our resource centre and online shop for £49.

Benefits roundup

Often, when people hear the word 'benefits' they think of welfare benefits such as Attendance Allowance or Universal Credit, but there are also concessions that you may be entitled to if you are visually impaired.

Handyperson scheme

Did you know that Cornwall Council runs a handyperson scheme to provide help with household maintenance and repairs for people in Cornwall who are over 60 or have a disability?

The scheme gives you access to trusted tradespeople and costs just £12 per hour if you are in receipt of a means tested benefit such as Guaranteed Pension Credit or Housing Benefit, or £18 per hour if not. This doesn't include the cost of materials which are an additional charge.

They will take your details then your local Handyperson will call you back and make an appointment, usually within two weeks.

Types of job

- Small building repairs such as clearing guttering on bungalows or small glazing jobs.
- Minor adaptations such as the installation of grab rails, hand rails or temporary ramps.
- Odd jobs such as putting up curtain rails and shelves, moving furniture or assembling flat pack furniture.
- Changing washers or taps, renewing sealants, replacing toilet seats, or unblocking sinks.
- General home safety checks with remedial action such as fitting smoke and carbon dioxide detectors.
- Replacing electrical fittings such as sockets, light fittings.
- Falls/accident prevention checks with remedial action such as securing loose carpets.
- Security checks with remedial action such as fitting key safes and window and door locks and chains.
- Energy efficiency such as installing low energy light bulbs and draught proofing.

Travel benefits

Blue badge

If you are registered as severely sight impaired, you automatically qualify for a blue badge which allows the person driving you to park on the street or in designated car park bays. If you are registered as sight impaired you don't automatically qualify for a badge and will need to contact Cornwall Council to discuss your eligibility.

On-street parking restrictions, such as limited parking areas, are relaxed for blue badge holders. Normal parking fees do still apply in Cornwall Council car parks unless your vehicle is registered under the council's exemption scheme. However, you automatically get one extra hour of free parking when paying a normal parking fee.

Bus travel

If you are registered as sight impaired or severely sight impaired or can provide proof of your sight loss from an eye specialist or social services, you are entitled to a Concessionary Disabled Person's Bus Pass. Your bus pass allows you to travel for free between 9.30am and 11pm Monday to Friday and all day at weekends and Bank Holidays. Outside of these times you must pay the standard fare for your journey.

To apply for your bus pass call Cornwall Council on 0300 1234 222.

Rail travel

If you have a visual impairment you are entitled to a Disabled Person's Railcard that enables you and the person travelling with you to get a third off the price of a ticket. You will need to provide proof of your eligibility for example your certificate of visual impairment or a letter stamped by social services. You do have to pay for the railcard, which currently costs £20 per year or £54 for three years. To apply, phone 0345 605 0525 or visit disabledpersons-railcard.co.uk.

Passenger Assist

If you require assistance when travelling by train, you can book in advance by phoning National Passenger Assist on 0800 022 3720 or by contacting the train company directly.

Accessible Apps

Apps (short for applications) are programmes that can be downloaded onto smartphones or tablet devices that allow you to perform specific tasks. They are usually accessed by tapping on an icon on the homescreen of your device, meaning that you don't need to type a website address into your internet browser to use them.

There are thousands of apps available, including ones specifically designed for people with visual impairments. Our Assistive Technology Officer, Dominic Hall, has put together a list of his top 10 accessible apps which is available in full on our website. Here is a selection.

Large Launcher

Compatibility: Android devices **Cost:** Free

Large Launcher replaces the original user interface of your smartphone or tablet with larger, more prominent icons and text. It uses large fonts with color-coded icons to ensure visually impaired users have no difficulty finding what they are searching for.

Dolphin Easy Reader

Compatibility: Apple iOS, Android & Windows devices **Cost:** Free

Dolphin Easy Reader is a free accessible reading app that gives you direct access to browse and download from your online libraries including Legimus and RNIB Book Share. You can play audio books or add a voice over to text only books. Text can also be copied from an external source to be read aloud.

You can change colours, alter the text size and highlight words or lines of text to best suit your needs. It is fully compatible with VoiceOver, TalkBack and Voice Assistant and offers free online help in a number of languages.

Huge Keyboard

Compatibility: Android devices **Cost:** Free

Huge Keyboard replaces the default keyboard on Android devices and features very large keys and emojis. The app is extremely useful for anyone who struggles to see the default keyboard on their smartphone or tablet device. The app also offers a variety of customisable features allowing you to select a theme from the Huge Keyboard library, adjust the size of the keys or change the sound and vibration of typing. You can also change the dictionary, typing and display settings.

BlindSquare

Compatibility: Apple iOS devices **Cost:** £40

BlindSquare can describe the surrounding environment, announce points of interest and deliver audible cues as you travel. When used alongside free, third-party navigation apps it is a powerful tool providing you with all the information you require to reach your destination.

The most important tools can be accessed through an audio menu via any headset or speaker that supports Apple's music controller. This means you don't need to touch your phone screen when you travel with BlindSquare as many of its features can be activated using the physical buttons on your headset or a Bluetooth speaker.

Synapptic

Compatibility: Android devices **Cost:** £190

Technically this isn't an app, it's a software package that you can buy to install on your phone but it's so popular and user friendly that we thought it was worth a mention.

Synapptic features a clear, simple menu structure meaning that it is easy for novice smartphone users and people who have only recently begun to lose their sight to use.

It includes various tools such as magnification, speech on every screen, voice recognition, email, an internet browser and a reading machine. You also have the option to change the colour scheme, menu layouts, magnification levels and speech options.
